Syllables and Phonotactics - Linguistics

Syllables with no coda are referred to as open syllables (so V, CV, CCV, CCCV, etc) Syllables with a coda are referred to as closed syllables (so VC, CVC, VCC, CCVC, etc) For processes like stress and tone, these might be sensitive to syllables of different "weights" Having a coda or a long vowel usually makes a syllables
